Senior officer in charge of undergraduate education. Responsible for all matters relating to undergraduate curriculum, academic regulations, academic standing, and academic advising. Oversight responsibility for offices of Admission, Financial Aid, Registrar, McGraw Center for Teaching and Learning, Princeton Writing Program, Program in Teacher Preparation, and the residential college system.

Chair, Faculty Committee on the Course of Study, Faculty Committee on Examinations and Standing, Faculty Committee on Undergraduate Admission and Financial Aid, Faculty Committee on Grading, Council of Masters (of the residential colleges); member *ex officio*, Faculty Advisory Committee on Appointments and Advancements.

Accomplishments include: institution of new general education requirements; significant expansion of international opportunities (establishment of Office of International Programs, International Internship Program, Bridge Year Program); establishment of McGraw Center for Teaching and Learning, Princeton Writing Program, Freshman Scholars Institute; major expansion of Freshman Seminar Program; implementation of no-loan financial aid policy; development and implementation of four-year residential college system; institution of University grading policy.

Member of the Council of Masters, which, in consultation with University administrators, sets policy for the University's residential college system.
